105.1 ECIA CHAPTER I PARENT INVOLVEMENT

1. Guidelines

The Farrell Area School District will involve parents and teachers of ECIA Chapter I students in the following ways:

1. Each child's parents will be notified in a timely manner that the child has been selected to participate in Chapter I, along with the reasons for selection.
2. Parents will receive a progress report a minimum of twice a year.
3. Conferences will be scheduled between parents and teacher.
4. Suggestions to the parents will help them promote the education of their children at home.
5. Materials will be provided by the district for the child's home education.
6. Timely information concerning the Chapter I program will be distributed. Such information will include plans and evaluations.
7. Parents' suggestions in the planning, development, and operation of the program will be solicited by the district.
8. Parent suggestions on how the school can work with parents to achieve the program's objectives will be encouraged.
9. Through the parent involvement program, the district will provide timely responses to parents' recommendations.
